A time of reflection

Of all the disciples, I love the stories of Peter the best.

Peter is someone who often suffers from what I call "foot-in-mouth disease" – i.e. he only has to open his mouth to put his foot in it!

Peter experiences such high and lows in his journey with Jesus: It is Peter who makes the declaration at Caesarea Philippi "You are the Christ – the Son of the Living God" and is told by Christ that he is "the rock" upon which the church will be built. Only a few moments later we find him trying to Jesus against going to Jerusalem and he is sternly rebuked "Get behind me, Satan"

It is Peter who gets so caught up in the moment of Jesus' transfiguration that he wants to build shelters on the mountain and try to prolong the experience...

It is Peter who confidently declares "I will never deny you"...only to do so three times in the courtyard. So perhaps it is no surprise that it is Peter – impulsive Peter - who is singled out in today's gospel reading while the others stay in the boat.

Jesus says to his disciples 'Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid' when he walks on the water to the disciples in the boat.,.and Peter being Peter, wants to try and walk on the water too!

I love Peter for his spontaneity, his passion, his courage to take bold steps. Yes, he sometimes got it wrong – but he is still the person Jesus chose to build his church.

Perhaps there is a lesson for us all in this – in the book of Revelation the Lord says to the church in Laodicea: "I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other!".

Peter could never be accused of being "lukewarm" – yes he made mistakes, but he was always passionate!

May we have that same passion in our discipleship, and the same courage to take bold steps in our journey with Christ.
