A time of reflection

How do we hear God's voice?

A simple question to which I wish there was a simple
answer. There are some clues though in our readings
today. When, like Samuel, we are young in the faith and

have little experience of God we may need someone older and wiser to help us to hear. When like Eli the years have passed and we have become hardened to life we may need to hear God speaking through the simple truths shared by those who are young in the faith. One thing is clear. If we are to hear the voice of God we need each other. If we feel God is speaking to us about something then we must have the graciousness to take it to others both older and wiser and younger and fresher than ourselves and ask them to help us discern what God is saying. Both readings remind us that God's call needs a response and the new testament helps us to understand that in Jesus we meet not only the one who will call but also the one who will walk with us as we journey in response to the call of the kingdom.
