### **Today's Readings:**

1 Corinthians 8:1-13 Mark 1:21-28

#### A time of reflection

Knowledge puffs up, love builds up...how true those words are!

Like many on the island, we are currently juggling the demands of work and home-schooling. We have always had a great respect for teachers, all the more so now.

Think back to your school days, who was the favourite teacher you had?

The best teachers are those who don't just impart knowledge - sometimes in ways that are condescending or make you feel small and ignorant - but those who encourage the student to discover for themselves, seeking that "A-Ha!" moment.

I wonder if that is how Jesus taught?
We are told he taught "not as the scribes" but as one with authority.

I suspect also, that He taught out of love - longing for his hearers to have their own "A-Ha!" moment, as they realise the deep all-embracing love of God their Father is such that it reaches even them. Saul the Pharisee-of-Pharisees, persecutor of the church, was full of knowledge. He knew the law, he knew the scriptures, he knew what he believed to be right - and this conviction led him to be zealous in all things. These days he would probably be called a fundamentalist, with all the negative stereotype that word brings to mind.

Since his encounter with the Risen Christ on the road to Damascus, Saul (now Paul) still teaches, he still shares his knowledge - but in everything he is driven by love for God, and love for people. Longing that they too may not just know about God's love found in Christ, but know and experience God's love for themselves.

Hence, his concern over eating food sacrificed to idols is not a relapse into Pharisaical adherence to the Law, but is grown out of love for the weaker believer that they may not stumble in their discipleship.

Knowledge puffs up, love builds up.

In all we do, let's seek to be a people who are filled with the love of God, building up those around us, His church, and our society as a whole.
