Readings: John 15:9-17 & 1 John 4:7-21 A time of reflection

One day a little boy in school was drawing a picture. His teacher came over to see his artwork and she asked him, "What are you drawing?" The young lad answered right away, "I'm drawing a picture of God."

"A picture of God?" she said. "You can't draw a picture of God. No one knows what God looks like." To which the little boy replied, "Well, they will do when I've finished!"

Well. it's true that no one knows what God looks like. None of us would be able to accurately represent who God truly is from a drawing, work of art or words of description either. Some would say that the word 'God' is harder to define than any other word in the dictionary - and in a sense that is true, for you could probably find as many interpretations as there are people. Yet, in our reading from 1 John 4, we see another approach that is truly remarkable. According to John, one word says it all: God is love! For some, such a definition is far too loose - so vague that it ends up saying nothing. Yet, the fact is that, when it comes to God, no other word will do, for God is love! It's as simple and straightforward as that - the one description that says it all - and if we lose that one simple truth, then we lose everything.

When we read the Bible, the story of God's love unfolds. From the very first page of Genesis to the last page of Revelation we read of God's unconditional Love for all - how he longs to save and heal - and draw us into a loving relationship. This is central to the Christian faith. And in our Gospel reading from John 15 we see how God's unconditional love works in our lives. Jesus encourages the disciples to keep his commandments and, above all, to love one another as he loved them. Then, did you notice that John describes it in this way:

'...if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.' (1 John 4:12)

Profound words. It's as though John is saying that it is you and I that hold the final jigsaw piece to God's love in our own hands. And God doesn't force us into fitting that piece into the puzzle of life. But if we let go and put that jigsaw piece into its rightful place, then the picture of God's love is made complete in us. It is as if love is with us 'in embryo', 'in seed'. If we practice Christian love, the love of God within us becomes full-grown. God's love in our lives is brought to its full measure when it flows from God to us, and then through us and out to others.

And, if we are born anew then we have the seed of love within us already. So, if you like, we hold the final jigsaw piece to the puzzle of life. Let us not hold back that piece, let us not hold back our love; let us give it freely, and let us use it - to complete the picture of God's love in us.
