Readings: Exodus 4:1-17 & 1 Corinthians 1:26 – 2:5 A time of reflection

Moses is often depicted as the great pillar of faith called by God on a rescue mission to fearlessly lead the Israelites out of slavery from Egypt. But if we take a careful look at Moses' calling – we see that he was far from the fearless leader we might imagine. In fact, from the image we have of him in our reading from Exodus 4 we see a rather shy and fearful Moses. He sees himself as someone with no strength or courage or eloquence when God calls him. He feels completely inadequate and makes every excuse as to why he can't do what God asks.

A similar sense of inadequacy is shared by Paul in our reading from 1 Corinthians. Paul is a bit like Moses. He says he does not come with eloquence or human wisdom. But the difference is, Paul is willing to offer what he has for God's Spirit to transform. Moses has yet to learn this lesson. So, God says to him: "What is that in your hand?"

What happens next is remarkable. Moses is willing to give to God his shepherd's staff, the tool of his trade, and God miraculously transforms it. The staff then becomes a symbol of God's power and authority for Moses' calling.

You see, the amazing thing we too can learn - is that God is greater than our inadequacies, and our lack of experience or talent. God calls us to work alongside him in his kingdom. Each one of us has a God-given purpose in life – and God always meets us where we are. He simply asks for trust - to give him what is in your hand - and he will transform it to bless you and bless others.
